



Standardized Assessment Parental Exclusion Form - Secondary

Weber School District values the partnership we have with parents in educating their students. Based on <u>Board Rule 277-404-7</u>, parents (or legal guardians) have the right to exclude their student from participation in certain standardized assessments. In order to exclude a student from an assessment, the parent/guardian should complete the form and email, mail, or hand-deliver it to the school administrator. Completion of this form ensures that administrators, teachers, and testing staff will be appropriately informed of parents' wishes and can act accordingly.

A parent who excludes a student from an assessment must understand that no score will be received for the specific assessment. Such an exclusion will not negatively affect a student's grade, nor will it limit the opportunities he/she has for participation in a full range of academic programs and services. However, parents should be aware that standardized test scores are often used to determine the specific instructional needs of students. If a parent excludes a student from testing, it is essential that they work collaboratively with teachers and administrators to ensure student success.

The data obtained from these assessments may be utilized by teachers and administrators to review student progress toward learning targets, plan instruction, provide teacher feedback, and give important achievement and accountability data to students, parents, and other stakeholders. Data from summative assessments also allows for public reporting about school quality. *All requests for Parental Exclusions must be received by the school no later than 24 hours prior to test administration.*

Description of State Assessments:

- ACCESS 2.0 Access for English Language Learners (grades K-12), assessment of English language proficiency, given once a year
- ACT (grade 11) College readiness assessment covering reading, math, English, science, and writing
- <u>AAPPL</u> ACTFL Assessment of Performance toward Proficiency in Languages (grade 3-9) student proficiency of target language in a dual language immersion program
- <u>CTE Skill Certification Assessments</u> End-of-course competency-based student assessments in Career and Technical Education required for certification
- <u>DLM</u> Dynamic Learning Maps (grades 3-11), Spring summative alternate assessment for students with severe cognitive disabilities
- <u>General Financial Literacy Assessment</u> End-of-course assessment for General Financial Literacy course
- <u>High School Civics Exam</u> Locally administered civics exam, questions from the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Test, passing score of 35 out of 50 questions (REQUIRED FOR GRADUATION)
- <u>High School Core Benchmarks</u> (grades 9-12) Optional productivity tools for teachers to use to help them get feedback on students' learning of the Utah Core Standards at the Reporting Category level. These tools have approximately 8-13 questions.

 - · Mathematics: Secondary Math I, II, and III
 - Science: Earth Science, Biology, Chemistry, Physics
