3. PTA Report: Roy High PTA is hosting, "PTA Connected; Take Charge of your Digital Life" at the Southwest Branch Library in Roy on April 25 at 7:00 PM. This is time for all families to get talking about digital kindness. Families will learn about how to use online platforms to spread kindness, hear from a panel of students from Roy High about the online experiences, explore TikTok's safety features, and have interactive conversations about online experiences, behaviors, and expectations.
4. Counseling Report:
  - a. Career Week was very successful as we had presentations for the 7th grade students, Reality Town for our 8th grade, and a tour of Ogden-Weber Technical Center for our 9th grade students.
  - b. Counseling Review by UBOE to examine the counseling practices at Sand Ridge; Our school did well/Passed
  - c. Registration/Enrollment Numbers
    - i. 2021-22 (Oct 1, 2021 - 912); (Current 898); Staffing 880
    - ii. 2022-23 (projected) - 874 - The same number of teachers will remain at Sand Ridge. Teachers will not need to take any buyouts, leaving more time for PLC, collaboration, and planning.
  - d. Program Areas of Growth - LIA; ESL, Spanish, Drama, Choir, Piano
  - e. Incentive Activity - Students 3.5 or higher/increase of .5 higher; (based on 3rd term) Qualified students will be posted outside of the main office. students pay for Lagoon once they get there. First come; first serve; Parents welcome to take students; When can they start to reserve? Reservations for bus spot Monday, May 9 - Pay in the office
  - f. Credit Recovery is always available, but students will be able to work on credit recovery in the building the first two weeks of summer. June 6-9; June 13-16. Students/Parents should contact Mrs. Davis in the counseling office to get started.

6. Impact of New Schools for 2024
  - a. Naming Committees - Established to gather input from communities who will be impacted. New High School name announced at 4/13/22 WSD Board meeting.
  - b. Boundary Changes - A committee will be formed to review data and to make boundary adjustments accordingly
  - c. Enrollment - Should remain lower for the next couple of years, but hard to determine when new housing is being developed so quickly.
  - d. Administrative Movement - Announcements for upcoming school year at 4/13/22 board meeting.
7. Trust Lands Reports
  - a. Budget Spending for 2021-2022 (Current Plan) - Estimated Carry Over - \$7,828.00
  - b. Budget Plan for 2022-2023 (Upcoming School Year): Create math labs for students in each grade (7th, 8th, 9th) who need additional help in the area of math, staffed with certified math teachers (\$32,000.); Provide funding for a 2 part-time Student Advocates who can offer multi-tiered support in ELA, math, and science (\$47,000.) One advocate, Marci Reed is funded through Project Roar; Fund a partial salary for a Mental Health Specialist to provide emotional support to students so they can achieve academically to

their full potential (\$12,750.); Fund Chromebook/Computer lease agreements and repair expenses (\$32,000). Distribution - \$ 123,962.00; Projected Expenditures - \$123,750.00; Estimated Carry Over - \$8,040.00
