2. COVID Information

a. Cases:

- i. There continues to be a substantial drop in the number of overall cases. This is the first time we've been under 100 total cases since about November. Our quarantine numbers are also way down. The only hot spot right now is Rocky Mountain. They just hit 15 but there are five cases dropping off the list over the weekend. North Park had approached the threshold last week, but their numbers are back in check. In fact, all of the elementary schools are in good shape right now. You'll also notice the number of employee cases is very low. All of this is great news heading into February!

b. Elementary and Secondary Schools - ESSER II (Closing the Gaps)

- i. The ESSER funds are on-time funds and are to be used "to address learning loss related to COVID-19"
- ii. As per SB1, these ESSER funds distributed to schools must be used for summer school programs, after-school programs, temporary classroom aides, temporary counseling, extended school year, extended school year, extended school day, Saturday programs and tutoring, Individualized learning plans for students who are at risk of academic failure, mentors and tutors, At-home visits to provide books and learning materials to students; or, Covi-19 mitigation supplies for individual use.
- iii. A Root Cause Analysis will take place to dive into data and find where there are the greatest needs.
- iv. Curriculum professional Developments will be available for teachers who wish to participate. (\$500. Stipend for each teaching completing the training. (Tied to Root Cause Analysis).
- v. Teachers will receive supply money
